TWO PART WORKSHOP SERIES ON FARM TRANSITION ISSUES SCHEDULED FOR CRAVEN COUNTY FARMERS AND LANDOWNERS

New Bern, NC (May 1, 2013) – NC Cooperative Extension Craven County is partnering with Mount Olive College's Lois G. Britt Agribusiness Center to conduct a two part series of farm transition workshops for county farmers and landowners. Mount Olive College received funding from the USDA Risk Management Agency to conduct farm transition regional events and workshops in eastern North Carolina.

The workshops will be specifically focused on the tools of farm transition and what participants need to know when they inherit land, sell land, receive or give land as a gift.

The May 30 workshop will include:

- A review of the Present Use Value Tax program by specialists from NC Department of Revenue and how PUV is affected when property is transferred.
- Forestry management and what is needed to maintain existing assets.

The August 29 workshop will include:

- An overview of estate planning strategies and how the tools, such as wills and trusts, operate to accomplish certain goals that involve estate tax planning and asset distribution planning.
- An estate tax update and how the changes in tax laws affect farm transition and estate planning.
